While listening to the young men from the high school do a wonderful job of leading the worship service last night, I was struck by the phrase “manifold grace of God” (I Pt 4:10). When I think of a manifold, I think of an exhaust manifold on an engine. It connects many cylinders and combines what comes out of them into one stream. Think of the many (manifold) ways God has shown grace to his people throughout time. When the Israelites were slaves in Egypt, He brought them out by His grace. When they were a ragtag group of refugees in the wilderness, He made a covenant with them and chose them as a special people by His grace. He gave them the law to guide them and bless them by His grace. He gave them land and an inheritance by His grace. By His grace, He offered them restoration and reconciliation time and again when they had transgressed His law. He healed sick, He provided food, He disciplined, He encouraged, He warned, He gave hope, all by His grace. His grace certainly comes in many different forms, or as Peter says, is manifold. But in the true form of what the word “manifold” means, those many channels of Gods grace are brought together into one powerful stream when Jesus takes on the form of a human servant and offers Himself as the ultimate sacrifice for sin. If you look around you may see many forms of God’s grace (sunrise, nature, relationships, love) but the ultimate expression, where all those “graces” are brought into one is Jesus.

The English Bible (Part 2)

The Great Bible was an English translation authorized by the Church of England in 1539, but a more significant English translation followed—the Geneva Bible (c. 1560). It was the first Bible to add numbered verses and chapters for quick reference—Shakespeare's works quote from this translation. This was the standard version for over 100 years. It retained over 90% of Tyndale’s translation and was a significant source for the King James Bible (c. 1611). The Geneva Bible was the first English translation taken to America by the Puritans and Pilgrims. Nevertheless, when the King James Bible was published, they were so large that they were chained to the pulpits in every church in England. It took decades for King James to surpass the Geneva Bible. Here’s how it read when published in 1611:

For God so loued the world, that he gaue his only begotten Sonne:
that whosoouer beleeueth in him, should not perish, but haue
everlasting life.

A note of interest: the first Bible printed in America was in the native Algonquin language by John Eliot in 1663.

Noah Webster, after whom Webster’s Dictionary is named, translated the Bible into the vernacular in 1833. Many remained loyal to the 1611 KJV and refused Webster’s version. Yet, in the 1880s, England produced the Revised Version to replace the KJV. By then, scholars had discovered more ancient manuscripts, making a revision necessary. Until this time, the Bible had eighty books. In the 1880s, the Apocrypha was eliminated, leaving the sixty-six books we have today. Americans produced the American Standard Version in 1901 in response to the Revised Version. This was the standard version until 1971, when the New American Standard was printed. The NASB was considered the best word-for-word translation of the Bible from Hebrew and Greek into English ever produced. In the same year, the first paraphrase of the Bible was created—The Living Bible. Another translation philosophy had arisen.

In the last half century or so there seems to have been a move in our society toward the adoption in the wider American population of what I call the use of "cultural" hymns. By this, I refer to the practice of adapting perfectly good old Christian hymns to secular use in all sorts of situations.

Two such hymns immediately come to mind and they are:

It is Well With My Soul & Amazing Grace. Both have been Christian favorites for generations of worshippers but both hymns seem to have now become standard fare at any and all kinds of situations that may have little or nothing to do with the core messages of either hymn. Especially in the case of ***Amazing Grace***, crowds of folks can be seen standing around trying to mouth some of the words but one has to wonder how many of them have a real understanding of what they are singing.
