Rejecting the Religious Leaders

(Luke 20:1–19): The theme of this section is authority, and Jesus and his opponents engage in a verbal chess match to vindicate or delegitimize Jesus. The authorities are attempting to get Jesus to blaspheme. The question they asked, if answered straightforwardly, would be that God's authority is the cause of all that Jesus has done (e.g., driving out the money changers). Had he given that straightforward answer, they could have accused him of blasphemy and sought a death sentence. Jesus parries the question back to them. He's trapped them with his question because either answer has profound consequences. Immediately after this episode and before verse nine, Matthew contains a story (Matt. 21:28–32) that is not recorded in Mark or Luke. It's an extension of asking about John the Baptist's baptism. The following parable is intended to press further in response to their question about authority. The planter is God; the tenants are those given stewardship over Israel. The servants sent are the prophets. He finally sends his son because, surely, the authority the son has will be respected and compel obedience. Moving on, Jesus recites Psalm 118:22–23, a pilgrimage Psalm sung en route to Jerusalem for Passover. It becomes evident who targeted this, but nothing could be done because a vast crowd was present.

(Matthew 22:1–14): Doubling down on the rejection of the religious leaders, the parable of the great feast further emphasizes how they will be rejected. Invitations to such a feast were usually sent some time ahead, specifying the details. Once the day comes and preparations are made, the guests who've agreed to come are sent for, so this refusal would have been considered a grave insult. Illustrative of Jesus' ministry, he's taken in the outcasts who wouldn't have normally been invited because they would accept the invitation, unlike the religious elite. Since the king invited the outcasts, he likely provided them with proper attire (cf. 2 Kings 10:22). The clothing in the parable is meant to represent the righteousness given by God through Christ (Rom. 3:21–26; Gal. 3:26–29). Having one guest improperly dressed was inappropriate. When the king asks "how," it may be better to think of "how dare you," given the Greek term used. This is like a person who accepts discipleship but doesn't conform to the gospel. *–Steven*

Open Your Hymnbooks to

Some folks in our midst have never before heard that statement made in a church service. A few of us Stone Age relics remember very well a time when printed hymnbooks were not only available but were an essential part of our worship experience.

In last week's bulletin, I closed with the statement that "*The hymnbook is the second most important book in the life of the church.*" But printed hymnbooks have not always been a part of Christian worship. Historians tell us that the first printed hymnbook as we think of it was compiled by the Bohemian Brethren in Prague in 1501. As was customary at the time, no music was printed. The oldest printed hymnbook that is still in regular use is the **Ausbund**, issued by the Amish in 1561.

The first hymnbook printed in British North America was the 1640 **Bay Psalm Book** - which was actually a psalter - a collection of the Psalms set to meter.

Printed music in hymnbooks is a relatively recent phenomenon, dating for only the past 160 or so years.
