Two Tales of Dealing with the Dead

(Luke 8:26–40) The area they visit is predominantly non-Jewish. Even more repulsive was that a man lived among tombs, something considered unclean. Jews believed that, in addition to being unclean, an area of tombs was a popular haunting place for unclean spirits. The danger and strength of the unclean spirit are evidenced in v. 29. The abyss, or bottomless pit, according to some translations, was where evil spirits were kept captive (cf. Rev. 20:1–3). Ancient exorcists found that demons sometimes asked for concessions when pressured to evacuate their host, so this request was common. Jesus' sending them into swine, who then plunged into the water and drowned, would have been understood as the demons being imprisoned by the water. The response of the people asking him to leave may have resulted from economic loss and the fear of Jesus being a dangerous magician, despite the positive results.

(Luke 8:41–56): As Jesus heads to Jairus' house, a woman with a constant blood flow touches his garment in faith for healing. According to Jewish law, she would have been considered unclean because of her issue (Lev. 15:19–33) and faced not only the physical problems associated with her condition (possibly anemia) but also social issues for having to be kept from others. The daughter was twelve, and the woman had had her health condition for twelve years. This may be why the stories intertwine. They would have typically understood her touching Jesus as making him unclean, but in this instance, she was healed. The conventional way of thinking about these things wasn't applicable here because of who Jesus was.

The people had gathered at Jairus' house because even the poorest person was worthy of having mourners. Usually, two flute players and a mourning woman were the minimal crowd gathered to mourn with the deceased's family. Still, Jairus held a prominent position, so many people would have gathered, which was why Jesus put them outside. Mourners usually did this quickly because of the heat and rapid decomposition of bodies in Palestine. Yet, they all saw that she lived, and Jesus had something to do with it.

Nothing New Under the Sun # 1

Very often, things that we think are new & glitzy are, in fact, found to be quite old. There is no better example of this than the modern PowerPoint system that affords churches the ability to flash hymns from Paperless Hymnal & other sources upon massive screens.

In actuality, as early as the 1600s, a Dutch scientist by the name of Christiaan Huygens invented what was then called the Magic Lantern system, an early type of image projector.

These contraptions were just an assemblage of metal and glass parts that could project images for large audiences to see. The first ones used candles as a light source and, in 1743, what was called a "Lanthorn Show" was put on in Salem, Massachusetts.

In the 19th century, the "Limelight" system replaced candles as a source of light but limelight was very dangerous. Then came light projection via kerosene lamps. In the 20th century, electricity provided a welcomed light source. *More next week!*
