The Rich Young Ruler

Next, we meet the rich, young ruler. He's somewhere between twenty and forty years old. Mark notes that he came and knelt before Jesus, so this isn't someone trying to catch him in a trap. The young ruler is genuine. He respectfully addresses Jesus as "Good Teacher" in Mark and Luke. Jewish writings exhort one to bless God as the truly Good: "Blessed is he, the good and the doer of good" (*m. Ber.* 9.3). This was likely why Jesus rejected the address.

In Matthew, the ruler asks Jesus what he lacks, but in Mark and Luke, Jesus tells him what he lacks. Since he was unwilling, Jesus illustrates how difficult it is to enter the kingdom of heaven for the wealthy by the camel passing through the eye of a needle. Some have suggested that the eye of the needle was some opening into the city where a camel would have had to get on its knees to ease in, but there's no evidence for that. Jesus is speaking about a sewing needle. The impossibility of the scenario raises concern among his disciples. They wonder if anyone can be saved, missing the point he was trying to make. When Peter asks about them, Jesus assures them they will be rewarded since they have left everything.

The concluding parable in Matthew means to stress the generosity of God. People may come to faith in him at different points in their lives. Some of us grew up in church. Others may arrive late and in old age. God's generosity is for everyone, and though some may put in more work, the reward is the same for those who haven't put in as much. It's his to do with, and this is what he chooses to do with it.

Awaiting The Trumpet Call # 2

As a follow-up to last week's article on the well over 200 identified cemeteries in Calloway County, it is worth explaining to young folks why there were so many early burials on private property rather than in cemeteries established cemeteries.

Times in the 19th & early 20th centuries were hard. Roads, if they existed at all, were often impassable, especially in the winter months. Funeral homes as we understand them were few and far between so most of the niceties that we associate with modern funerals & burials did not exist.

To be sure, there were in some communities, cabinet makers who doubled as undertakers and who might come by the home of the deceased to help with very rudimentary preparations to quickly bury the body. In fact, formal funeral homes as we understand them did not come to Murray until the establishment of J. H. Churchill's in 1886.

Thus, countless early burials took place in back of the orchard or some other easily available place.
