Boldness After Pentecost

Thus far, boldness has been a driving force in apostolic preaching (Acts 2:29; 4:13). Imagine a subordinate soldier addressing his superior with the request, "Permission to speak freely," to which the superior grants leave. This is the sort of boldness with which they preach. They speak freely and without reservation. Accompanying their boldness were healings, signs, and wonders. These only further encouraged their boldness. These were the primary means of drawing attention to the gospel they preached. Yet, the healings brought attention, which resulted in opposition as well.

Sometimes, our hesitancy to speak the good news comes from fear. We're afraid we'll be questioned and not have the answer. We're worried we'll be rejected, but God is who is rejected and not us. We're concerned about so many things, yet we don't have to worry about the persecution they faced. Despite the threats, they prayed for boldness to keep preaching in Jesus' name. As Jesus' disciples, we should share that good news with people. Think about the good news we share: rebuke night at Sirloin Stockade, when our team wins, our children achieve something, etc. What's better than these good things is what Jesus has done for us. Because it can be a polarizing message, or we may fracture relationships, we pray for boldness. If there's something we don't know, we pray for wisdom (James 1:5-8).

Something important to also remember is that we, Christians, are a nation unto ourselves (1 Peter 2:9-12). As a people in exile, we are to be otherworldly and embrace our identity as a member of the holy nation. If we focus on this nation, it's discouraging. Yet, the goal ought to be to make more new citizens of the kingdom of God. "For our citizenship is in heaven," so Paul wrote to the Philippians (3:20). The ancient city of Philippi was a Roman colony, and her citizens were automatically citizens of Rome with all the perks and privileges that carried—among which were certain tax exemptions. Some of them may have never been to Rome but could appreciate and understand the pride of citizenship despite having never been there. For Christians, this is our reality: we have not yet been to heaven, but that's where our citizenship is and, with it, all the blessings that accompany being members of the Kingdom of God.

HYMNBOOKS # 3

In the later years of the 19th century, many churches, especially in the south, used various cheaply produced paper-back collections that often doubled for congregational singing as well as tent revivals, encampments and so forth.

Good quality hard-back books were slow in coming to the Churches of Christ but some of the earliest ones were produced by the Gospel Advocate Company and the McQuiddy Printing Company, both long-time Nashville businesses.

In 1907, McQuiddy printed a hard-back hymnal edited by T. B. Larimore (1843-1929) and William J. Kirkpatrick (1838-1921). Although not associated with the Churches of Christ, Kirkpatrick served in several capacities during that time period in helping Gospel Advocate & McQuiddy in the production of hymnals. Larimore, of course, was a household name in the CoC at that time.
