Deconstruction is a buzzword among many thinkers in certain circles. It involves questioning, doubting, and ultimately rejecting certain aspects of held beliefs. It has become a part of many Christians' reality too. Most of us might say that there are certain things we've had to unlearn because of bad teaching. We've essentially deconstructed that from our belief system. For example, I used to believe in precision obedience. The way that works is that we follow all of God's commands to the letter, and wherever we fall short is where we rely on God's grace. Now, I place God's grace at the beginning and realize that keeping his commands is a part of being a follower of Christ. Are they all important to observe? Absolutely, but grace doesn't fill in where I fall short. Instead, grace brings me to the transformed life in Christ, leading me to want to obey God as best I can.

Ultimately, deconstruction can be taken to the extreme as anything can be. When all one does is deconstruct every aspect of their belief, they may not believe. Deconstruction can lead to relativism and rejection of absolute truth. In the broader American society, the *modus operandi* of many is to tear down social norms and institutions. For example, many talking heads refuse to define what a woman is, or they are so broad in their definition that there's no consistency. This would deconstruct biological and social beliefs that have been established for centuries. However, the rational person might accept that there are rare occasions when androgyny is at issue every now and then.

Sometimes a primary motivation undergirding deconstruction isn't to seek to understand but to undermine. Some believe that any well-established entity (government, religion, etc.) must be eliminated if not bent to the will of the oligarchical thinkers. Christianity has always accepted that human understanding is limited, yet we still seek knowledge. There are times when sincere Christians arrive at different conclusions (Rom. 14:1-5). We may even wrongly interpret God's will (cf. John 5:39-40), but not everything is subject to each person's whims.

I believe absolute truth exists, and absolute truths are just that—truthful. However, there are also other areas where uncertainty exists. Whenever I've learned something that undermines previously held beliefs, I try to stick with what I feel is sure and absolute and work from there. It's not wrong to fact check (cf. Acts 17:11) or have skepticism (1 John 4:1), but to constantly live in doubt about what's always been leads to an agnosticism that is always on sandy ground.
