Both James and Peter quote the same verse from Proverbs 3:34 when they say to us, “God opposes the proud but gives grace to the humble.” (Ja 4:6 & I Pt 5:5). Can you imagine God actively opposing you? The same God who puts entire armies into flight, the same God who calms torments and storms, the same God who spoke the world into creation? I’d rather be a recipient of His grace. But leaving aside this thought, I want to bring our attention to the two different applications these writers ask us to make. James talks about us humbling ourselves before God. In verse 7, after quoting Proverbs 3:34 James says, “Therefore submit yourselves to God.” Peter tells us that we should all “be submissive to one another, and be clothed with humility.” We had a very active weekend here at the Glendale Road Church of Christ. Ladies Day was on Saturday, Don and Kathy Iverson were here reporting on the work in India, we showed thanks to our teachers with a lunch after services, and the young men from the middle school class lead the evening worship services. All of these were great events but sometimes there is a tendency for us to do one of two things. On the one hand we can look at how active we are and be proud of ourselves for our accomplishments. Remember what James 4:6 says? According to Jesus the glory is for God (Mt 5:16) On the other hand we can be jealous of the ones who had public recognition at these events. Read I Peter 5:5 again. There is lots going on here. Will God oppose us or give us grace?

The English Bible

The fourteenth-century Oxford scholar John Wycliffe produced the first English manuscripts of Scripture. He opposed the established church because he believed it was contrary to Scripture; therefore, he made the Bible in English, accessible to the common man.

For god loued so the world; that he gaf his oon bigetun sone, that eche man that bileueth in him perish not: but haue euerlastynge liif.

His manuscripts were produced from the Latin Bible, the only source available at the time. Wycliffe so angered the Pope that he had his remains dug up, crushed, and scattered in the river forty-four years after he died. One of Wycliffe’s followers, John Hus, continued his mission, advocating that people should be able to read the Bible in their own language, and he opposed the tyranny of the Roman Church. Hus was burned at the stake, and Wycliffe’s manuscripts were used as kindling for the fire. The year was 1415, and Hus’ last words were, “In 100 years, God will raise up a man whose calls for reform cannot be suppressed.” In 1517, Martin Luther nailed his famous ninety-five theses to the door at Wittenberg—an act often regarded as the spark that began the Reformation.

Many others would follow in this endeavor, but William Tyndale was the first to print the New Testament in English. At the time, this was forbidden, so he had these printed in Cologne. However, authorities discovered his intentions, and the printing was halted as he fled. Around 1526, he had 3,000 copies produced in Worms. Tyndale was strangled and burned at the stake in October 1536. Only three copies of his Bible are known to exist today. One of Tyndale’s disciples, Myles Coverdale, continued his work, translating the Old Testament and producing the first complete Bible in English in 1535—the Coverdale Bible.
