Truth or Not The Truth

We must be people who speak truth. Ephesians 4:25 says, Wherefore, putting away falsehood, speak ye truth each one with his neighbor: for we are members one of another. The context of Ephesians 4 tells us that speaking truth is part of what it means to be a new creation in Christ; it is at the heart of being a Christian. Colossians 3:9 parallels Ephesians; Lie not one to another, seeing that ye have put off the old man with his deeds.

For the Christian who is striving to follow Jesus' teaching, it is a simple matter of observing Jesus' teaching on this subject. In Matthew 5:37 Jesus said, But let your communication be, Yea, yea; Nay, nay: for whatsoever is more than these cometh of evil. James echoes Jesus comments in James 5:12 But above all things, my brethren, swear not, neither by heaven, neither by the earth, neither by any other oath: but let your yea be yea; and your nay, nay; lest ye fall into condemnation.

Sometimes it is hard to tell the truth. People don't always want to hear it because it exposes the darkness in their lives and people love darkness better than light (John 3:19). As Christians, however, we are obliged to tell the truth in love (Ephesians 4:15) and we speak truth because we do love (1 Corinthians 13:6). Let us do so and be people who love truth regardless the consequences of speaking it and let us never be involved in the sin of lying.

When Jesus Returns

The Thessalonians received the gospel amidst persecution (1 Thess. 1:6; 2:2, 14-15; 3:3-4). Paul had been accused of preaching a king other than Caesar: King Jesus (Acts 17:7). Even in his letter, he speaks about the kingdom of God (2:12), so Paul reminded them that they were looking forward to the day when Jesus returned (1 Thess. 1:10; 2:19; 3:13). Even in the face of all of this, hopelessness still abounded in their minds because of what they suffered and the unanswered questions they had, especially about those who had already died (1 Thess. 4:13–18).

It's likely that martyrdom, at this time (AD 50), was the exception and not the rule. Those who had died for the faith were rarities by this time, so questions were prompted. Among them might have been, "What will happen to those who died before the Lord's return?" The soul and body will be reunited (2 Cor. 5:1-10), except the body we will receive will be a heavenly body, unlike the present bodies we occupy. We will not grow old. We will not have aches and pains. We will not be prone to sickness or disease. We will live eternally before God in glory and immortality. Read 1 Corinthians 15:35–55 if you want to know more about this.

The "coming" of the Lord, in Greek, denotes a royal visit. These types of appearances by royalty were met with great pomp and majesty. We who are alive at this time will not go before those who have died in the Lord (v. 15). First, we begin with the shout and voice of the archangel (cf. Matt. 24:30-31). This particular scene reminds us of Exodus 19:16-20. There's the sound of the trumpet, the descent of the Lord, the cloud, and God meeting Moses that parallel our passage. There's also Psalm 47:5. This royal procession appears fantastic. However, at the time of His coming, the dead rise first.

Those living will go to "meet" the Lord in the air. This word for meeting referred to emissaries from a city to meet the dignitary and escort him in the city. This is the exact language used of Caesar and his emissaries, but it's here used of Jesus. And we shall always be with the Lord (cf. Rev. 21:3-5).

Library E. Bailey I Long Thy Gates To See

One of the most popular songs of the past among Churches of Christ was "*There Is A Habitation*" (# 860 in our hymnal). The words are by Love H. Jameson (1811-1892) who was a prominent evangelist, writer & singer of the Stone-Campbell movement and was centered primarily in Indianapolis.

The tune ZION CITY, by James Holmes Rosecrans (1844-1926) first appeared about 1882 in several song books issued by the Fillmores of Cincinnati. The fact that the Fillmore Publishing Company issued dozens of song books in the late 19th & early 20th centuries accounts for the widespread popularity of this song among Stone-Campbell churches. The tune was originally called O SION, SION in some early song books.

There is a Habitation, Built by the Living God For All of Every Nation Who Seek That Grand Abode."
