En route to Jerusalem (Matt. 20:17–34)

Jesus addresses the twelve and tells them what will come, but they don't understand. To them, they're going to the city to celebrate Passover, but this Passover will be when Jesus is crucified for the sins of the world. Next, it's uncertain who, because Matthew has James and John's mother make the request, while Mark has the brothers ask Jesus. Their mother was likely Salome, the sister of Mary, Jesus' mother (cf. Matt. 27:56; Mark 15:40; 16:1). James and John were Jesus' relatives. The request comes on the heels of Jesus speaking about judgment, so the right hand is the highest place of importance to a king, and the left is second to the right. King David is depicted at God's right hand (Ps. 16:11), and the Messiah is at God's right hand (Ps. 110:1, 5). Those who present themselves and are disfavored are dismissed to the left (Matt. 25:33ff), so the king's left hand may be some type of general.

Can they drink the same cup as Jesus? They might envision themselves as heroes who stepped in during a crisis. This doesn't go well with the ten, who resented them for trying to use familial ties to their advantage. Pivoting from this request, Jesus points out how the Gentiles rule, unlike how things will be in his kingdom. The greatest among them will serve.

Only in Matthew are there two blind men. Mark and Luke have only one, Bartimaeus. Also, Matthew and Mark have Jesus leaving Jericho, while Luke has him drawing near the city. All accounts have him/them cry out to Jesus as "son of David," a messianic title whose reign was accompanied by the restoration of sight to the blind. When asked, Jesus moved with compassion, obliged, and healed.

The hymnbook that we use contains a section of hymns titled "Resurrection Medley, beginning with # 342. One of those featured is "**We Saw Thee Not**" which Derek recently led on a Sunday morning. (# 342 in our book).

It was written by a woman named Anne Richter about 1857 and has undergone several revisions and resetting over the years. The tune SHAW was written by well-known American hymnist, Knowles Shaw (1834-1878) about 1877 and quickly became popular in evangelistic circles. Jorgenson's **Great Songs of the Church** included it in the first edition of 1921 and it has become a favorite among Churches of Christ since that time.

A resurrection song that is even better known and sung much more widely in American evangelistic churches is the ever popular "**Low In The Grave He Lay.**" (# 344 in our book). Robert Lowry (1826-1899), one of the great gospel song writers of the 19th century, is credited with both words and tune in the mid 1870s. This song has brought comfort and joy to generations since that time and was included in Jorgenson's **Great Songs** from the first edition onward.
