Feeding 4,000







SEE YOU SUNDAY!

The feeding of the 4,000 is an entirely different occasion than the feeding of the 5,000 that John recorded. The locations are different from some points. John's location was predominantly Jewish, and this one is a Gentilic region. Numerology will also distinguish the two. In John, five loaves feed 5,000, the five corresponding to the Law of Moses (Gen., Exod., Lev., Num., and Deut.). When they finished, they collected the leftovers into twelve baskets, corresponding to the tribes of Israel and the apostles. The feeding of 4,000 gives seven loaves and baskets. Seven was symbolic of completeness, as in seven days of creation and seven days of the week. Numbers weren't always literal, as we use math. They often had meanings.

For example, the number three was divine (Father, Son, and Holy Spirit). The number forty hinted at a trial or probation period—Israelites wandered, and Jesus was tempted for this period. The number four represented creation—four seasons, corners of the earth (North, South, East, and West). Six represents man because he was created on the sixth day and labored only six days. Since Hebrew lacked punctuation, the way a person would emphasize something was to repeat it. For example, in Isaiah 6, the seraphim say that God is holy three times, thus emphasizing his holiness. When we read about the number of the antichrist being 666, it's intense evil because humanity perpetrates evil.

Jesus had performed many signs up to this point, yet they still requested more of him. He points out that they can read the weather when the sky is red, but not the sign of the times (Matt. 11:3-5). He's just healed the lame, blind, deformed, mute, and deaf, but it isn't enough. Jesus had previously alluded to the sign of Jonah (Matt. 12:38-45), speaking of the Lord's crucifixion, burial, and resurrection. That would be a sign to Israel that he was their Messiah. Yeast, being very little, can grow into something big (cf. 1 Cor. 5:6; Gal. 5:9). Matthew has Pharisees and Sadducees, but Mark adds Herod to the list of whose yeast they should beware. Once more, Jesus uses his spittle in the healing process. The one being healed would have naturally equated healing with spittle. Interestingly, Greeks will "ftou" at a person for good luck, so spittle in some cultures is something entirely different. -Steven

Honor To Whom Honor is Due #3

What we, in the Churches of Christ, know as the Restoration Movement has gone through several different phases of development over the last 250 or so years.

The desire to return to simple NT Christianity can be found throughout the past 2000 years of church history but it is sometimes difficult for researchers to document long periods of time when reliable hard records have been lost.

The first great period for which we have substantial documentation begins in Scotland with such men as John Glas (1695-1773) and Robert Sandeman (1718-1771) whose movement, known variously as Sandemanian or Glassite churches, spread throughout the British Isles and on to North America.

The next major period of development is usually called the Second Great Awakening which happened in North America from c1790 to c1810.

The third major period of development encompasses the spread of the restoration message in America of the 19th century. *(more next week)*
