Next, Mark and Luke inform us that the disciples argued about who would be the greatest in the kingdom as they traveled. Jesus presents a child and says, "This is who they must become to be like, because this is the greatest in the kingdom." Next, Mark and Luke include an account in which John points out that someone not with them was casting out demons in Jesus' name. They tried to stop him, but Jesus urged them not to. This shows that the power was in Jesus' name and not in the person's own ability. Later, however, the capacity is vested in the apostles and those chosen by them to foster unity and show the true power of the Holy Spirit as distinct from magic (Acts 19:11–20).

Any person who offends or causes another to stumble risks hellfire. Jesus urges whoever follows him to sever anything from their lives that could cause this offense or stumble. First, we must understand that the word translated as "hell" is "Gehenna," which means "Valley of Hinnom." This is a valley south of Jerusalem. During the reigns of Ahaz and Manasseh, it was a place where children were sacrificed to Molech (2 Kings 16:3; 21:6; Jer. 7:31; 32:35). King Josiah defiled the valley, ending the practice of child sacrifice. It, after that, is alleged to have been a place for burning garbage so that a constant cloud of smoke rose and a fire burned continually (Mark 9:40–18). Dogs and wild animals would gnash their teeth to get what they could eat from the outer edges; they would have understood so much of the language concerning hell in this light.

Jesus, next, discusses restoration and forgiveness. He gives three steps:

- 1. Try to resolve it between you and them in person.
- 2. Take one or more people to confirm all the facts.
- 3. As a last result, it's to go before the assembly.

Jesus affirms that the assembly's decision would be in tandem with his will. When Peter asks how often he should forgive, he is generous by offering to forgive up to seven times. The rabbis taught that three times was required, based on passages in Amos, and after the third, one didn't have to keep forgiving. Therefore, Peter believed his more than doubling was generous, but Jesus had something more in mind. Telling a parable, the point is that the debt of sin we have accrued with God is of such a magnitude that we could never hope for forgiveness. Yet, God is willing to be merciful to us despite this. When a person does us wrong, that debt pales in comparison.

Library E. Bailey **Ye Thankful People**

Some of the best hymns ever written have come to be thought of as Thanksgiving Hymns, although some of them were not specifically written for this purpose.

One of the best ones is "Come, Ye Thankful People, Come" words by Henry Alford in 1844 and the companion tune by George Elvey in 1858. It is ideal for congregations because of its good solid 4/4 time with a cadence that lends itself to strong singing. (# 729 in our current hymnal).

Another very familiar hymn of thanksgiving is the Dutch hymn "We Gather Together To Ask The Lord's Blessing" written back in 1597. While not in our book, most folks are familiar with it.

"Now Thank We All Our God", also familiar to most Americans is of German origin and first appeared in 1636.

Of more recent origin (1897) is the ever-popular "Count Your Many Blessings" given to us by Johnson Oatman & Edwin O. Excell. It's # 742 in our hymnal. "Name them one by one and it will surprise you what the Lord hath Done"
