Elementary Principles

In Hebrews 6:1–2, the author sets forth the elementary principles of Jesus. Before arriving at this, he scolded the Hebrew Christians for not progressing in the faith. He believed they should have been teachers by this time, but they still needed "milk" rather than "meat." This gives us a blueprint. Six principles are named that the author believed they should have settled moving on to maturity.

Because of their spiritual immaturity, they were on the verge of departing from faith in Jesus. They were also enduring persecution (Heb. 10:32–34), which added to the reasons they were close to leaving the faith. The entire letter to the Hebrews was to show how Jesus is supreme to Judaism. They were in such a state that they were going to revert to what the author calls the copy and shadow of the heavenly reality (Heb. 8:5). He begins by showing how Jesus is greater than the angels because angels delivered the law to Moses (Acts 7:38, 53; Gal. 3:19; Heb. 2:2). Jesus is supreme over the law itself, Moses (the lawgiver), and even his priesthood is of a different order and greater than the Aaronic priesthood at the temple.

Because of all this, the first principle the author mentions is repentance from dead works. These are activities that do not serve God and result in sin. Since Jesus' sacrifice is greater than the temple's, their consciences should be cleansed from such activities (Heb. 9:14). Given the context of the letter, I'm inclined to believe these are works of the law. Most religions in antiquity were centered on works. There were specific acts that the worshipper needed to perform to be on the god's right side or to curry favor from them.

What was unique about Christianity was faith toward God, which the author mentions next. This likely meant obedience or fidelity as it appears in other passages (Heb. 3:4; 10:39). Its meaning is also akin to hope (Heb. 11:1; 12:2). Faith, a loaded term, carries several meanings, as mentioned. Yet, when you place your hopes on works, you're not trusting God and his promises. Nor are you trusting the sacrifice of Jesus to be sufficient. If we could work our way to heaven, why did Jesus have to die?

HYMNBOOKS # 11

William Washington Slater (1885-1959) is a name that is today unfamiliar to most members of the Churches of Christ but, in the last century, his was a household name, especially in Oklahoma, Arkansas and Texas.

During the 20th century, he became a sought-after song leader and conductor of singing schools throughout the above-mentioned states. In addition to his music career, he also preached for decades.

To older generations, two of his compositions will be quite familiar. He arranged the tune that we know today as ANGRY WORDS which is sung to "**Angry Words! O Let Them Never**" (# 719 in our current hymn book).

Slater also composed the tune ALONE AT EVE which has been sung by generations to the hymn "**Walking Alone At Eve**" (# 874 in our hymnal. Several of his descendants became widely known in church circles of the 20th century.
