The Light of the World

When Jesus says he is the world's light (John 8:12), it takes us back to creation. Before God spoke light into existence, there was darkness and chaos. The earth was formless and empty. This was the primordial state of the heavens and the earth. Then, God said, "Let there be light." God created the heavens and the earth, and Jesus recreates. He, like God, brings order out of chaos. Since the fall, humanity has lived in disorder and chaos. Jesus will rectify that.

Sadly, the teaching is detoured by Pharisees. At this point, Jesus distances himself from the Law (v. 17). It required multiple witnesses, and Jesus previously said that Scripture, God, the Holy Spirit, the works he performed, and Himself all testified to who he was (John 5:31–47). He mentions that his father testifies on his behalf, so they ask questions about his paternity. Given the nature of Mary's conception and Jesus' birth, the question may have been meant to sting (v. 41).

Jesus used his language similarly to that of God in the Old Testament.

- "I am" (v. 28) "I am" (Exod. 3:14).
- "I am" (v. 58) Same as above.

The Greek phrase Jesus uses here is the same as the one in the Greek Old Testament when God gave Moses his name. Jesus was saying that he is the "I am." This is why, at the end of the chapter, they aimed to stone Jesus—this came off as blasphemous to them.

Christ offers them freedom, but they don't believe they are enslaved. Yet, they forget they were once enslaved in Egypt, Assyria, and Babylon. At the time, the Romans were their sovereigns. They may have considered slavery to be idolatry (Jer. 2:10–14), but Jesus explicitly identifies slavery to sin—something Paul also explained in Romans 6:5–20. Abraham was considered the father of the Jews, but Jesus points to their actions as betraying that relationship. He, instead, calls them children of the devil because of their murderous intentions. Jesus presented himself as the light of the world. In contrast, they walk in darkness (v. 12), the flesh (v. 15), in the devil (v. 44), and death (vv. 51–52). Those who confess Christ are associated with light, spirit, life, and God.

By calling Jesus a Samaritan (v. 48), they may have intended it to be an insult. Yet, it may have been an honest mistake because Jesus was in Galilee so much, a region of Judea north of Samaria. Then, somewhat childishly, they accuse Jesus of having a demon—likely a response to his calling them children of the Devil.

New Year's Resolution Time Approaching

There's something about a fresh calendar that stirs hope in us. We buy planners, join gyms, draft lists. But before we make promises to ourselves, hear the promise of God: "Because of the Lord's great love we are not consumed... his mercies are new every morning" (Lamentations 3:22–23). The newness we need doesn't start with our willpower; it starts with God's mercy.

Paul puts it this way: "Not that I have already obtained all this... but I press on to take hold of that for which Christ Jesus took hold of me" (Philippians 3:12). Notice the order. Christ takes hold of Paul, then Paul presses on. Identity before activity. Grace before goals. You don't resolve your way into God's love; you resolve from God's love.

So, here's our frame for the year: not self-improvement projects, but Spiritled transformation. Romans 12:2 calls it being "transformed by the renewing of your mind." And Jesus shows us how: "Abide in me... apart from me you can do nothing" (John 15:5). Resolutions are often about speed; abiding is about direction. A speedometer can tell you how fast you're going; only a compass can tell you if you're headed home.

As odd as it might sound, the one man who exerted more lasting influence over the Church of Christ in Murray has been essentially forgotten today. James Riley Hill (1848-1904) preached all over Calloway & Henry Counties during the latter part of the 19th century.

After the Murray church split about 1900, he led a small group of individuals who wanted to re-establish an *a'cappella* church in Murray. Maurice Bucy & Cecil Thurmond later recorded much of the information about this effort.

Having no building and little money, this group met in homes, the Courthouse, the Opera House, banks and other rented locations and the leadership was composed of a group of seven individuals who were James Riley Hill, Nathan T. Hale, Samuel F. Holcomb, Lucius D. Curd, Abraham D. Thompson, Maurice Bucy and Mrs. W.P. Morrison.

Due to several deaths and other circumstances, this little group disbanded in 1904 and is sometimes referred to as the 1901 Church of Christ. Several of these individuals still have descendants in the churches of Murray.

For those who are really interested in this history, there are several articles in the 2022 *Bicentennial History of Calloway County* as well as in the 2024 *Bygone Churches of Calloway County*. Lochie B. Hart's 1978 history on the First Christian Church also has some information.
