### The Rich Man and Lazarus

#### LOOKING FORWARD

#### NOT BACKWARDS

Certainly! Philippians 3:13-14 is part of a letter written by the Apostle Paul to the church in Philippi. In this letter, Paul addresses various themes, including joy, unity, and the importance of spiritual maturity.

In the verses leading up to 3:13-14, Paul discusses his own journey and past accomplishments, including his background as a Pharisee and his strict adherence to the law. However, he emphasizes that despite these achievements, they don't matter as much as knowing Christ and experiencing the power of His resurrection.

**When Paul talks about "forgetting what is behind and straining toward what is ahead," he is encouraging believers to not be hindered by past mistakes, regrets, or even past successes. Instead, he urges them to focus on their relationship with Christ, and the future God has for them. The phrase "press on toward the goal" reflects his drive to live a life dedicated to God and to aim for spiritual growth and transformation.**

Overall, the context emphasizes the importance of looking forward in faith, pursuing spiritual goals, and finding strength in Christ rather than being held back by the past.

The point of the story of the rich man and Lazarus isn't to give us a blueprint for the afterlife. That's how it's used and preached, and I will give it that focus today, but I want to ensure we understand what it's about. It all began because He healed a man with dropsy on the Sabbath in Luke 14. Overall, this story illustrates what Jesus says in Luke 16:10-15, pointing out the sins of the Pharisees. We must avoid hasty generalizations as if everyone who is well-to-do is evil and everyone poor is righteous. There are wicked and righteous in each category. Still, because Jesus focuses on the sins of the Pharisees and their love of money, which Paul later wrote was the root of all evil, we must understand that the wealthy, evil individual who cares not for others is whom Jesus has in mind here.

Over a century earlier, Pompey cut Judean territory and robbed many Jews of their land. Herod the Great's high taxes drove small farmers out of business. By the first century AD, many peasants worked as tenants on larger estates. Others became day laborers with no steady job except during harvest. This was the condition throughout the empire. Aristocratic priests withheld tithing income from poorer priests, which was their only means of income. The Law itself, which this audience was supposed to have known and practiced well, commanded caring for the poor among them (Deut. 15:7-11). This behavior, or lack thereof, follows you beyond the grave.

We can feel pain or comfort (Luke 16:22-23). In Jewish and early Christian literature, Abraham's bosom is the same place as "paradise" (Luke 23:42-43). These were Jewish terms for where the dead go as they await the resurrection. The word translated as "bosom" has various meanings. One Greek scholar rejects the term "bosom" and uses the term "valley." His reasoning for so doing is that when the same word appears at the end of verse 23, it's plural. Abraham can't have more than one bosom; if he did, our English Bibles don't translate the term as plural (bosoms) but singular. When "valley" is used, it makes sense given the other topographical language used— "great gulf" (v. 26). The term is elsewhere translated as "bay" (Acts 27:39). What's also of interest is that the name Lazarus was the Greek name for Eleazar. The name means "God has helped." Just who was this? Abraham's servant from Damascus was to be his heir until he had Isaac. We will be recognizable and recognize others (Luke 16:24). We are rewarded or punished based on how we live on Earth (v. 25). We have no second chance (v. 26). We will have no excuse (vv. 29-31).

### **Henry Dees # 3**

As a result of the \$1,000 bequest from the Dees estate which would be the equivalent of almost \$19,000 today, the struggling Water Street Church was able to make several improvements to their very basic building that had been built in 1913.

They were able to reconfigure the auditorium to make the main entrance on Maple Street, to have basement classrooms built into the new basement, to add classrooms on either side of the pulpit area, to install a baptistry and to add a better heating system in the building. By most standards, it was still bare-bones primitive but significantly better than they had used since 1913.

This structure remained essentially unchanged until the move to Poplar Street in 1950. There are several current members at Glendale who remember being at Water Street prior to 1950.

As you pass Green Plain Cemetery, remember that two early benefactors, Henry Dees and Abe Thompson, lie there!!
