#### Why Church History is Important to Me (Part 1)

I was a student at the Nashville School of Preaching but had a vast experience with "Christianity." What I mean by that is that as a child, I was taken to a Baptist Church, but I had charismatic and Mormon relatives also. We'd go to their church whenever I'd stay with some relatives. When I began dating my wife, I attended Mass with her on occasion. Yet, when my mother married my stepfather, the one I call "daddy," he and his family went to a church of Christ. By the time I was a student, readying myself for ministry, I felt pretty good about churches of Christ. Still, I had some unsatisfied questions, so I went to one of my teachers—a gospel preacher. "If what we do is correct, then I should be able to see it in history and even note when things changed. Do you have any recommended reading on this," I asked. And boy, did he. That began my love of early church history—a technical phrase used to refer to Christianity between AD 1–500. I focused on what the New Testament taught in certain areas, followed those until changes were made, and felt I couldn't be on more solid footing. History taught me that though we might differ in explaining passages and their meanings, observing practices regardless of their theology is unimpeachable.

When I was first in ministry, I had a Bible study with a couple who'd invited my wife and me for lunch one Sunday after church. Our daughter played with theirs, and the study began with the question, "Why are there so many churches?" This was a question I once had, too. The church we read about in the New Testament is what we seek to be. In the second century, some leadership changes were made—likely to maintain sound doctrine while warding off false teachings. As time passed, that leadership structure grew and became more complex, eventually resulting in the papacy, cardinals, bishops, etc. Centuries later, some church leaders wanted to translate the Bible into the people's common language, which was met with rejection from the powers that be. Some people were killed for this effort, but something more significant happened. In the sixteenth century, a monk named Martin Luther encountered a guy named Johann Tetzel. He was preaching and selling indulgences. Indulgences were a scheme where Tetzel preached about them, saying if you paid a sum, a loved one who was suffering in purgatory would be granted relief. Luther believed this was a perversion of the sacrament of penance. Based on this and a few other concerns, Luther nailed ninetyfive theses to the doors of the University of Wittenberg, where he was a professor. This sparked the Reformation. Luther didn't intend to found another church. He merely wanted the Catholic church to reform.
