Sometimes I hear the complaint about the boring worship. Some feel excused from attendance because “church is boring.” The songs are too slow, the prayers too long, or the preacher..., sometimes these are factors that can be fixed. This, however, gives the idea that the worship is for those in the pew. We need to understand that worship is for the Lord. **A better thought might be, Is the Lord bored with our worship?** Perhaps the Lord is bored with the murmurer. The murmurer (or complainer) is a continual problem in many congregations. Never satisfied he or she always has an opinion on one thing or another. It may be the sermon length or the songs dragging or that someone didn’t say hello. They don’t suffer in silence, not the murmurer! Murmuring is a symptom of the rejection of authority (see Exod. 16). When authority is accepted the worshiper will accept without complaint that not everything will always be to their liking. Note that we are warned against murmuring:

Do all things without grumbling or questioning (Phil. 2:14)

“Nothing we do today, will make God love us any more than He already does, and nothing we do today, will make Him love us any less.”

How a Mistranslation Drives Interpretation

Something we were always taught in biblical studies was to research texts ourselves. That can be done by comparing translations of a passage. Other times, it can be the utilization of commentaries and other aids. For those fortunate enough to grasp the original languages, translating them for ourselves was preferable. One passage bothered me: “Have you considered my servant Job” (Job 1:8)? It reads as if God is offering Job to the adversary as a sort of pawn to be used to prove a point. But what was the end? That Job is so good? That God can throw anything at him, and he’ll still be faithful?

When you look at the Hebrew and compare translations, most of them get it wrong. They have something similar to what I gave above. However, the Orthodox Jewish Bible and Young’s Literal Translation have something altogether different. They have something more literal to the language: “Have you set your heart against my servant Job?” This translation speaks about God knowing what the adversary was thinking instead of God offering up Job to a game of who’s right.

Whenever we read Scripture, despite what the words say, anything that goes against the grain of God’s character must be questioned. After all, we’re not talking about one of the pagan gods whose as emotionally driven as a teenager. Our God cares for humanity and wants what’s in our best interest. One prominent view is that God is sovereign and can do as he wishes. I agree with the statement in theory, but God won’t mistreat a person. Unfortunately, the more common translation of that phrase doesn’t say much about the good of who God is.

Whenever I’ve struggled with a passage or doctrine, I’ve always chalked it up to my not understanding it correctly. I’ve not diminished my faith in or view of God. He’s the greatest good there is. Sometimes there are things too complex for my mind to grasp, and I’m often prone to not understanding something correctly. Knowing the Scriptures and studying them is a beautiful exercise of faith. Asking questions about the text leads us to a better understanding of it. Hopefully, it also leads to a greater love of God as well.


