Jesus' Teachings in John 15–17

Vine imagery was a prevalent theme in Israel as God's covenant people (see Isaiah 5:1–7; 27:2–6). Mostly, when vine imagery is used to describe Israel, the nation fails to bear fruit. This often leads to judgment on the unfruitful vine. Jesus, however, is the true vine, so where Israel has failed, he brings forth the fruit they were meant to produce (Ps. 80:8–16). Unlike Jesus as the good shepherd and us as his flock, the vine illustrates the interconnectedness between Jesus and his disciples. The temple was also decorated with golden vines with large clusters of grapes. God, as the vinegrower, is depicted as the gardener. The word “prunes” shares a root with a term translated as “cleanse.” In verse two, the term is *kathairei*; in the next verse, it is *katharoi*. Verses six and seven play off verse two, where an unfruitful vine deserves to be thrown in the fire—a reference to divine judgment (Ezek. 15:1–8). On the subject of joy, we see the part it played in the early church (Acts 13:52; Rom. 15:13; 2 Tim. 1:4).

With Jesus' departure, he will send the Holy Spirit, their advocate (16:7). He will convict (16:8), and we later notice the works of the Spirit through the apostles confirm what they preach (Mark 16:20; Heb. 2:2–4). Jesus once more mentions Satan as the “ruler of this world.” Similar terminology is used by Paul regarding Satan (2 Cor. 4:4; Eph. 2:2; 6:12). He went by various names: Beliar (2 Cor. 6:15), Mastema in the book of *Jubilees*, and Belial in the Qumran texts. He is juxtaposed with the Spirit of Truth (16:13). Yet, in telling them about his impending departure from the world, he gives arguably the greatest line ever: “Your sorrow will be turned into joy” (16:20). Of all that they will endure, Christ reassures them that he has overcome the world (16:22). The term *neinkeka* has as its root *nikao* from which our English term “Nike” derives. Nike was the goddess associated with “victory,” which is what the Greek word means. Here, when Jesus says he has “overcome” the world, he's using that term for victory.

Farewell discourses often concluded with a prayer, which John records to show that Jesus was sent from the Father. The authority Jesus has been given (17:2) was in keeping with messianic expectations (Is. 9:6–7; Dan. 7:13–14). Knowing God wasn't head knowledge as the Greeks conceived, but living in fellowship with him. This fellowship is contingent on salvation. Having prayed for himself, Jesus prays for his disciples (17:6–19). Often, verse eleven is invoked for the church's unity, “That they may be one as we are.” Yet, Jesus was specifically praying for his disciples, who would become his apostles in a short time. Closing his prayer, Jesus prays for all believers (17:20–26).

The Church's 2nd Most Important Book # 11

Those who pay attention to the details at the bottom of the pages of our hymns will have noticed the name of Jessie Brown Pounds (1861-1921). This remarkable woman left her imprint on several different types of literature.

Although born into a frontier family of modest means, she was college educated which was highly unusual for her day. She edited several religious journals of the Restoration Movement, wrote the lyrics for over 800 hymns and published 7 novels as well as 80 short stories.

She was married to a well-known preacher in Cincinnati and was asked by the Fillmore Music Company to provide the words for hymns to be published in their journals and hymnals. She was a woman who is considered to have been far ahead of her time on several levels. Her most lasting influence on the church today can be found in her hymns - 6 of which are in our current hymnbook, they are as follows:

Beautiful Isle of Somewhere
Will You Not Tell It Today?
The Way of the Cross Leads Home
Anywhere with Jesus
O 'Twas Wonderful Love
I Know that My Redeemer Liveth
