## An Unlikely Pairing

The Pharisees and Herodians wouldn't have naturally teamed up (Matt. 22:15), except on this occasion. Because many are looking for a reason to accuse Jesus, they plot a catch-22. The Pharisees were nationalistic in their view of Israel, so paying taxes to Caesar was an acknowledgment and validation of the occupying government. It's as if to say it's okay. Plus, since tax collectors are often equated with sinners, there's the added element of working with sinners and becoming sinful. The Herodians, however, were favorable to Roman rule. Here's the catch: if Jesus says pay, he will be accused of being anti-Israel. If he says not to pay, he will speak treasonously of Rome. Either way, they believe they have him backed into a corner. Since the coin reflects the image of Caesar, render that to him. However, humans bear the image of God, so we are to conduct ourselves as ambassadors, representing our King's interests and wishes.

Sadducees were the priestly and aristocratic class of Israel. They are often associated with the temple, while the Pharisees are associated with the synagogue. The former did not believe in resurrection (cf. Acts 4:1-2; 23:6-10). Their symbolic story is designed to show the absurdity of believing in the resurrection. The premise is based on the redeemer-kinsman concept demonstrated in the book of Ruth. At the death of a husband and the absence of a child, the next of kin—often a brother—was to take her as his wife and produce heirs in his brother's name (cf. Deut. 25:5-10). This string of marriages without any heir begs the question. However, they invoke the law of Moses as if they knew it, but the question demonstrates that they do not.

The greatest and second greatest commands sum up the whole of the law. If you read the first four of the ten commandments, they focus on one's relationship with God. The last six are about neighbors. In the following passages (Matt. 22:41-46), Jesus asks the Pharisees a question to begin this round. In the first passage he cites, he refers to God. The second refers to David. Jesus states that he is superior to David since David refers to him as "Lord."

### The Church's 2<sup>nd</sup> Most Important Book # 2

There is something significant about the fact that every important figure in our Restoration history has deemed it a priority to compile some sort of hymnbook for congregational singing and this is not simply an accident or some sort of coincidence.

They all had an understanding of the place of singing in the worship life of the church even if the singing in their day wasn't exactly like ours in all respects. For instance, hymnbooks were usually words-only with tune suggestions such as AZMON, OLD HUNDREDTH, ORLINGTON, HOLY MANNA and many others printed at the top of the page.

The song leader often "lined out" the verses or phrases first for the congregation and then the people would repeat that line before he went on to the next line - a tedious and cumbersome practice to be sure but a necessary one for many folks could not read the words for themselves.

Due to the cost and scarcity of printed books, churches often did not supply hymnbooks in the pews as we do. Folks who could afford to buy one, often brought their own books from home every Sunday and these personal books were prized indeed. The finer copies were bound in leather with the owner's name embossed on it.
