## Judgment

Concluding Hebrews 6:2 in discussing elementary principles Christians should know, we arrive at the final one. When we think of judgment, we're likely to think of the event negatively. However, judgment is good, as the Scriptures remind us (cf. Psalm 2, 98; Isaiah 11:1–10). God's judgment will set things right once and for all. Jesus' death was the single act that reconciled us to God, and we no longer dread judgment, but we must realize that it won't be a great day for some people.

Any sin is a personal affront to God.

- “How then can I do this great wickedness, and sin **against God**” (Gen. 39:9)?
- “If a person sins and commits a trespass **against the LORD** by lying to his neighbor about what was delivered to him for safekeeping, or about a pledge, or about a robbery, or if he has extorted from his neighbor ...” (Lev. 6:2)
- “So David said to Nathan, ‘I have sinned **against the Lord**’” (2 Sam. 12:13).
- “**Against You, You only, have I sinned**, and done this evil in Your sight—that You may be found just when You speak, and blameless when You judge.” (Ps. 51:4).

Some of the scenarios involved other people, but in the evaluation of the inspired authors, though others are involved, it is ultimately against God that sin was committed.

Jesus will be our judge (John 5:22). He will judge according to our hearts (1 Cor. 4:5), words (Matt. 12:36–37), and deeds (2 Cor. 5:10). Those who give lip service to God won't be saved (Matt. 7:21–23). Those who do not aid others will not be saved (Matt. 25:31–46). Those who do not know God and obey the gospel will not be saved (2 Thess. 1:8–9).

A few things won't save us that we sometimes put too much hope in. **Sincerity**—Jacob believed Joseph was dead for years until they were reunited. **Zeal**—Saul of Tarsus was zealous for God, but he murdered many Christians (Romans 10:1–3). **Religious acts**—Cornelius the centurion was well spoken of and often gave alms and prayed, but Peter was still sent to preach the gospel to him (Acts 10:1–2).

### Matthew 5:5

**Blessed are the meek,  
For they shall inherit the  
earth.**

Meekness (*praōtes*) in the NT is a natural virtue, a Christian grace, and one of the “fruits of the spirit” (Gal 5:23). Jesus said, “Take my yoke upon you, and learn from me; for I am gentle (meek) and lowly in heart” (Matt 11:29). Paul said, “I...entreat you, by the meekness and gentleness of Christ—I who am humble” (2 Cor 10:1). Paul not only extolled and emulated this virtue of Christ but commended it to his churches. “I therefore, a prisoner for the Lord, beg you to lead a life worthy of the calling to which you have been called, with all lowliness and meekness...” (Eph 4:1f.). He admonished the Colossians to put on the graces of “compassion, kindness, lowliness, meekness, and patience...” (Col 3:12). Likewise he commends it to Timothy and to Titus (1 Tim 6:11; Titus 3:2). James instructs Christians to “receive with meekness the implanted word” (Jas 1:21); and recommends to the wise and understanding that “By his good life let him show his works in the meekness of wisdom” (3:13). Peter wrote that all Christians should always be prepared to make a defense of their hope “with gentleness and reverence” (1 Pet 3:15).
