Jesus and the People (John 6)

Jesus withdrew after receiving word that John was dead (Matt. 14:12). His disciples returned, telling him all they had done (Mark 6:30–32). They took time to rest, but the crowds soon found them. Jesus, having compassion, began healing those in need and noticed 5,000 people needed to be fed. Philip is tested because he doesn't understand (v. 9; cf. John 14:8–10), but Andrew recalls how Elisha had multiplied bread for 100 men (2 Kings 4:42–44) and looks to use the food brought by a young boy. This was when he performed the miracle of feeding the 5,000. There are parallels between this story and the biblical account of the Exodus.

- 1. In Exodus, God performed signs and gave instructions regarding the Passover. So here, at the time of Passover, multitudes follow Christ because of the signs he performed.
- 2. In Exodus, the Hebrews ate unleavened bread because they were hastily escaping, taking no provisions. So Jesus feeds the crowd, who also lacked provisions in their hurry to see him.

One expectation for God's anointed one was that he would be like the prophet about whom Moses wrote (cf. Deut. 18:15). Given that Jesus teaches as he does and works the miracles he does, they conclude that he is the one. Yet, they are looking for an earthly king to rule as Moses led and David ruled Israel. Until Judea came under Roman rule, it had enjoyed independence for a century or so. Before then, they were vassals of Greece, Persia, and Babylon for many years. They wanted the foreigners out of their land and self-governance, so they wished to take Jesus and make him a king by force. However, what does it say that he didn't want to do that?

A lesson from Jesus' example is the distinction between civil authority and the kingdom of God. Denigrating elected officials isn't in tandem with Jesus (Acts 23:1–5; cf. 1 Peter 2:13–17; Rom. 13:1–7; 1 Tim. 2:1–4; 1 Sam. 24:6; 26:11). God is not so detached from creation that He doesn't play any part in it. He establishes and tears down kingdoms (Jer. 18:7–10). A king's heart is like streams in the Lord's hands, and he turns them wherever He wants (Prov. 21:1).

Prayer is essentially a conversation with God. It's not just about asking for things; it's a way to express gratitude, seek guidance, confess sins, and build a relationship with the divine.

Jesus and Prayer

Jesus often withdrew to solitary places to pray (Luke 5:16). He prayed before significant events, such as His baptism (Luke 3:21) and before choosing His disciples (Luke 6:12-13). In the Garden of Gethsemane, He prayed fervently, demonstrating submission to God's will (Matthew 26:36-46).

The Power of Prayer

- <u>Healing</u>: James 5:14-16 speaks of the prayer of faith healing the sick.
- <u>Peace</u>: Philippians 4:6-7 promises peace that surpasses understanding when believers present their requests to God.

Attitude in Prayer

- <u>Humility</u>: 2 Chronicles 7:14 calls for humility in prayer.
- <u>Sincerity</u>: Matthew 6:5-6 warns against praying for show and encourages praying in private.
- <u>Forgiveness</u>: Mark 11:25 highlights the need to forgive others when praying.

Prayer, as depicted in the Bible, is a deeply personal practice. It's more than just a ritual; it's an ongoing dialogue with God that nurtures faith and spiritual growth. Whether it's through words of praise, cries for help, or silent reflection, prayer is a powerful tool for believers seeking a deeper connection with God.

The songs that we see on those two gigantic screens each Sunday are the result of years of work by many individuals. The PowerPoint System came out in April of 1987 & was initially released for Mcintosh computers. Microsoft acquired PowerPoint in July of that year.

What we, in the Churches of Christ, have come to know as the Paperless Hymnal was the brainchild of a minister of the Hyde Park Church of Christ in Austin, TX in 1999.

Robert J. Taylor, well-known music enthusiast and hymnal publisher, established Taylor Publications in1988 at Montgomery, TX and he has been the driving force in the development of the Paperless Hymnal thru its various stages of development. A man named Joe Ed Furr of Abilene Christian University was the first to introduce the phrase Paperless Hymnal. One of the beauties of the system is that it does not require CCLI (Christian Copyright Licensing International) licenses or any other external fees.

The Paperless Hymnal, currently consisting of some 1500 songs, is produced in several volumes and is being constantly added to, corrected or improved in various ways. We need to understand that the Paperless Hymnal is not the only such system available
