## Jesus in Jerusalem Luke 13:22–14:24

Please help spread the word to members of the community who might visit with us on our Sunday evening Singing Night that the February Singing will be February 15<sup>th</sup> rather than February 8<sup>th</sup>. I know so many people look forward this monthly singing night. **We are so blessed to have Derek's leadership with his wonderful talent and willingness to serve.** We are truly blessed by him!

Luke continually reminds the reader that Jesus is traveling to Jerusalem. En route, he offers teaching, sometimes stopping along the way. Jesus is issuing an urgent call to respond in repentance to enter the kingdom, and he illustrates this in the following two parables. First, he's prompted by a question (13:23). Jews believed all Israelites would be saved, but those among them who wouldn't were those who denied the resurrection, the divine origin of the Law, who had read heretical books, who utter charms, who pronounce the holy name YHWH, and Epicureans (*m. Sanh.* 10.1). It's often said that all roads lead to God. Everyone must find his own way, but Jesus teaches that the door to God is narrow and only those whom he knows will be saved. Yet, this whole gospel is also all-inclusive.

Unlike previously, the Pharisees warn Jesus that Herod is out for him. The significance of referring to Herod as a "fox" may hinge on the belief that foxes were insignificant (Neh. 4:3). In Jerusalem, tombs were built to honor the prophets and other important figures (cf. Luke 11:47), but instead, often were prophets persecuted and put to death by leaders (cf. 2 Chron. 24:20–22). The visual illustration was known to agriculturalists. A mother hen calls her chicks to herself to protect them, and they find shelter under her wings. Jesus, likewise, has called Jerusalem and Israel to himself, but they have not come.

Remember that Jesus had shamed an entire synagogue by criticizing him for healing on the Sabbath (13:10–17). On another Sabbath, he heals but also makes a point of disarming them of any possible hypocrisy. The man afflicted suffers from excessive swelling that usually indicates a more severe condition. Whether he was invited to try to trap Jesus or if he just showed up is unknown. Some rabbis forbade aiding an animal on the Sabbath, but others allowed it in extreme emergencies or when the loss of life might result. Because of the mixed messaging on this topic, the crowd remains silent.

Depending on the arrangement, there may have been several small tables to accommodate three guests on one side. The center-most table would have been for the host and guests of honor, but some had already taken their seats at it. If one presumptuously takes this place, they may be disgraced by being asked to remove themselves to a lower table for someone more important. Nevertheless, it's better to be moved forward than backward, so he warns in verse eleven. People would only eat with those of their social class, but Jesus commanded that outcasts be invited to the meals of his disciples. Ironically, the church still struggled with this (1 Cor. 11:17–34).

### Enter S. H. Dees

After the Water Street congregation moved into their very basic, no frills, building in 1913, things remained essentially the same until an unexpected gift came their way.

Samuel Henry Dees (1846-1923) was one of Calloway County's wealthiest men at the end of the 19<sup>th</sup> century - having made a portion of his fortune in the banking business. When Dees and his wife, Eliza Ann Thompson Dees (1845-1921) both died in the early 1920s, they left no direct descendants as both of their unmarried sons had died in 1895. It is worth noting that Eliza Dees was a member of the large and prominent Thompson family, many of whom lived around Hazel and the Green Plain neighborhoods and who were influential in the founding of the Green Plain church in 1854.

On the other hand, S. H. Dees had been a life-long Methodist and a generous supporter of South Pleasant Grove, Hazel and other area Methodist Churches. Upon their deaths in 1921 and 1923, several churches, including Water Street were included in a large request that will be explained in next week's segment. ***They were unique people!!!***
