

Worship Doesn't Override Conduct

A staple of the Restoration Movement is doing things as they were in the Bible. A particular emphasis is given to subjects such as how one is saved, the organization of the congregation's leadership, and worship. We practice those as the apostles did with, perhaps, minor variations. We sing four-part harmony while they likely chanted. We gather in large facilities while they met in houses. You get the idea. What we do is what they did, but because we have emphasized worship, have we overlooked something else that's very important?

Some Christians operate under the impression that their proper worship of God excludes living a life complimentary of the worship that He seeks (John 4:23-24). "As long as we don't worship with instruments..." they say. "As long as we partake of the Lord's Supper every first day of the week..." they say. We claim to worship in spirit and truth, which we should, but have we made our bodies a living sacrifice to God in addition to that (cf. Rom. 12:1–2)?

Saul was anointed the king of Israel, and God gave him the commission to kill all the Amalekites for what they did to Israel (1 Sam. 15:2-3; cf. Deut. 25:17-19; Exod. 17:8-16). However, Saul only did some of what he was commanded to do (1 Sam. 15:14). He claimed that he disobeyed God because he wanted to worship God (1 Sam. 15:15). This led to his rebuke and rejection from being king. God wanted his obedience more than worship, and this theme appears repeatedly in Scripture.

David acknowledged that if God wanted worship, he would give it, but in his sin, it was insufficient (Ps. 51:15-16; cf. Prov. 21:3). Throughout Israel's history, they often substituted obedience for worship, thinking the latter absolved them from the former. Read all the passages where God addresses this matter (cf. Is. 1:11-17; Jer. 7:22-23; Hos. 6:6; Amos 5:21-24; Micah 6:6–8; Mal. 1:10). Worshiping rightly is essential. I don't wish to set up a false dichotomy here. However, living obediently to God should accompany it. Otherwise, wouldn't God simply tell us to quit as he did to those of old?

It may come as a surprise to some that the Federal Government officially recognizes 574 different Native American tribes and sub-tribes in this country. Many of these tribes are grouped into several major language families such as Muskogean, Athabaskan, Algonquian, Iroquoian and several others.

Many of these 574 language groups have produced their own hymnals and, as a member of the Mississippi Band of the Choctaw nation, Steven is in possession of a Choctaw hymnal titled Chahta Vba Isht Taloa Holisso which was printed by Global Bible Society in Asheville, NC,

This particular hymnal is words only and consists of several hundred numbers, mostly in Choctaw, with a few dozen English language numbers at the end. There are, of course, numerous tribal language hymnals with the music as well. (tune in same time, same station next week)
