

On Traditions & Hypocrites (Matt. 15; Mark 7)



The law is clear about honoring mother and father and note that every time Jesus cites this commandment in the gospels, he's speaking to adults. We often think it applies to children, but this command doesn't have an expiration date. Just because one can legally become an adult at eighteen doesn't mean they can dispense with the command afterward. "Our rabbis taught: What is 'reverence' and what is honor? Reverence does not sit in his parent's place, he does not contradict his [parent's] opinions, and does not judge [their disputes]. 'Honor' feeds and gives him drink; he clothes him and covers him and helps him to enter and exit" (b. Qidd. 31b).

The practice of Corban, once someone declares something Corban, means that it becomes most sacred and bars the one who made the vow from gaining profit from it. In this case, the son prevents his parents from having any benefit from the property. Legally, it only expresses the intention to give property to God and not the actual disposal of the vow. The person could keep the property in his possession but tell his parents that he cannot offer them help because it's dedicated to God. Concluding the discourse, Jesus tells those present that what comes out, not what goes in, is what defiles a person. This is the more significant concern.

The account of healing the Gentile woman's daughter that follows further illustrates that the kingdom of heaven is for all, though primarily for Israel. Jewish tradition referred to Gentiles derogatorily as "dogs," but Mark uses the term for a household dog, not a wild or scavenger dog. Her reply is another way of saying that you don't have to interrupt the meal plans if all you give is a scrap. Jesus wasn't concerned with being an itinerant miracle worker. His mission was to fulfill Israel's prophetic hopes, but doing this kindness for this woman's daughter did not take anything away.

The Quiet Power of Daily Habits

Big faith is built with small, steady steps. The early church "continued steadfastly in the apostles' doctrine and fellowship, in the breaking of bread, and in prayers" (Acts 2:42). Consider three habits this week:

- Pray simply and often (1 Thessalonians 5:17): begin and end your day with gratitude.
- Open the word (Psalm 119:105): read one chapter from the Gospels each day.
- Encourage someone (Hebrews 3:13): a note, a text, a call.

These practices won't make headlines, but they shape hearts. God works through ordinary faithfulness to produce extraordinary fruit. Start small, stay steady, and trust the Lord with the growth.

Honor To Whom Honor is Due #2

Steven Hunter is the 28^{th} pulpit preacher to serve this church since its re-organization as the Water Street Church of Christ back in 1909. Back in the formative years and on thru the Great Depression, many of them were what we would call part-time preachers.

Very often, the preacher did not live here during the week but came by train, usually from Nashville or Henderson, TN to fill the pulpit on Sundays.

For three years, from January 1928 thru December of 1930, two members of the local congregation did the preaching in order to save the church money. Both men, Mr. E. H. Smith and Dr. C. P. Poole, had relatively good incomes from their employment at Murray State and be it ever to their credit that they did the preaching until the church could afford to pay someone.

In January of 1931, Roy R. Brooks began serving to be followed by Harvey Wilhite Riggs and Thomas Vernon Pate. *(continued next week!)*
