The Laying on of Hands

Continuing Hebrews 6:2 to discuss elementary principles Christians should know, we arrive at a point that will seem foreign to many of us. There were various reasons for the laying on hands, some restricted and some not so much so. We read of the apostles and others laying hands on people to heal them. This is an example of a restrictive practice because not everyone can lay their hands on someone and heal them.

Another reason we see is to confer some special status to a person. At the church in Antioch, during a worship service, the Holy Spirit spoke and wanted Paul and Barnabas set apart for missionary work. After fasting and praying, the prophets laid their hands on them and sent them on (Acts 13:1–3). Another example of this is when the Ephesians elders laid their hands on Timothy for his work (1 Tim. 4:14). Paul had laid his hands on Timothy and conferred the miraculous ability to work wonders (2 Tim. 1:6). Timothy was also urged to not lay his hands hastily on anyone or appoint them for some service (1 Tim. 5:5).

When the first deacons were appointed, they were said to already be full of the Spirit (Acts 6:3), meaning they exhibited the fruits of the Spirit. They were also invested with authority to oversee the waiting on of tables for the widows. Later, we see one of those chosen working wonders and signs (Acts 6:8). They were appointed and given the ability to do the works of the Spirit. Up until this point, only the apostles were working such wonders and signs (Acts 4:33; 5:12). Later, the apostles went to Samaria to confer the Holy Spirit on the Samaritans in a way that they also worked miracles (Acts 8:14–19). We see the same thing happen several chapters later (Acts 19:1–7).

The three reasons for laying on hands were to heal, confer status, and transfer the ability to work miracles. Only the apostles could transfer the miracle-working ability, which is why we see less and less of such gifts in early church history. If they continued in perpetuity, they would be observable throughout history. Yet, by the third century, calculating liberally, there's no mention except a couple that would be classified as hearsay.

Thinking About Writing Hymns??? Maybe think again!! Of the unknown number of hymns that have been written in the last 500 or so years, only a miniscule fraction survive more than a few years.

For Instance, the great English hymn writer, Charles Wesley (1707-1788), is said to have written over 6500 hymns with maybe 25-30 of them surviving in general use today. (There are 16 in our current hymnal).

The great American hymn writer, Fanny Crosby (1828-1915), is said to have written upwards of 9000 hymns, depending on which estimate is used. There are 19 Crosby hymns in our current book and certainly her hymns still in general use would number fewer than 40.

The Father of English Hymnody, Isaac Watts (1674-1748) is thought to have written between 600-750.
