In Jeremiah 35 God commands Jeremiah to invite a group of people called the Rechabites into the house of the Lord and set wine before them and have them to drink. When Jeremiah does this, the Rechabites refuse saying that their father had commanded them that they should drink no wine forever. God uses this example to contrast the Rechabites with the people of Judah who had been unfaithful, not to the commandments of their forefathers, but the commandments of God himself. In Jeremiah 35:16 God says, "Surely the sons of Jonadab the son of Rechab have performed the commandment of their father, which he commanded them, but this people has not obeyed Me.

Sometimes simple acts of obedience in others can remind us of our own shortcomings of obedience to the Lord. Jesus rebuked those who forbid little children to come to Him and made the point that unless we accept the kingdom as they do, we will by no means enter it (Mk 10:13-16). I have often been reminded by the obedience of children, my own included, that they sometimes trust and obey authority better than I do, though I have more maturity and experience.

The chief priests and elders of the people thought that they were right with God, and yet Jesus said, "tax collectors and harlots enter the kingdom of God before you" (Mt 21:31). More than once I have seen morality in someone who does not claim Christianity and have been ashamed of my own deficiencies. God gives examples, let's learn to see them.

Post Resurrection

(Luke 24:33-43) When they return to join the other disciples, they are notified that Jesus has appeared to Simon (v. 34; cf. 1 Cor. 15:5). The significance of the revelation of Jesus and the breaking of bread reminds the reader of the Last Supper. Some argue that the Lord is most known through breaking communion bread because it reminds us of all his body endured for the sake of the cross. At this point, they're in a locked room because the report of the empty tomb has spread, so they are afraid of the Jews (John 20:19). Jesus appears as a spirit and startles them. He rebuked them for their unbelief since they hadn't believed the women who relayed the empty tomb and resurrection to them as given by the angel (Mark 16:14). He demonstrates that he is there in the flesh by having them observe that he is flesh and bone, and then he eats with them.

(John 20:20-21:25) Jesus breathing on them to receive his spirit reminds us of God creating humanity and breathing into them the breath of life. Now, the apostles will be able to receive the Holy Spirit when the time comes. The power to forgive or bind is no longer with the synagogue and Pharisees but with the apostles in the messianic community of believers. Next is the account of Thomas, who has forever since been associated with doubt. Eight days later, Jesus appears to them again when Thomas is among them (1 Cor. 15:5). Thomas declares Jesus his Lord and God after seeing and believing, and Jesus pronounces a blessing on those who do not see but believe. John gives an excellent point of reference in that what has been recorded is to prove that Christ was the Messiah, though much more could have been written.

Jesus' resurrection body is such that it foreshadows what ours will be (1 Cor. 15:42-49). Yet, his body is transfigured and incorruptible, so he isn't visible unless he willingly shows himself. The large fish catch indicates that these fishermen would become fishers of men (cf. Jer. 16:16). A lot of allegory appears in the early church's understanding of this passage. First, Peter dragging the net indicated his leadership in the church. Second, that the net was unbroken signifies that the church is invincible. Third, the number 153 symbolizes all nations of humanity. The breakfast resembles the feeding with fish and loaves. Peter is now the subject because he will be the leader and needs to be restored the same number of times as he denied Jesus.

The Church's 2nd Most Important Book # 19

William Washington Slater (1885-1959) is a name that few in modern-day Churches of Christ recognize, although he influenced the course of our singing in the 20th century.

Like many of the old-time preachers of his day, he wore many hats and among those were Gospel hymn writer, composer, publisher, hymnal editor, periodical editor, preacher, singing school teacher and song leader for Gospel meetings throughout the states of Arkansas, Missouri, Oklahoma and Texas.

He was associated at various times with the Stamps-Baxter company of Dallas, the Firm Foundation Publishing House in Austin, Texas, the Eureka Normal School of Stigler, Oklahoma and his own Slater Company, based in Ft. Smith, Arkansas.

His own *Gospel Songs & Hymns* was issued in 1944. He is best known today as the composer of the tune to "*Walking Alone at Eve*" in 1917. He also arranged the tune that we sing to "*Angry Words! O Let Them Never*" in 1944.

Some today would dismiss Slater as a minor figure but, in reality, his influence over the Churches of Christ of the 20th century was anything but minor!!!!
