## The Mission of the 70 (Luke 10)

As we turn the page to 2026, we do so with gratitude for God's steady hand through the past and confident hope for what lies ahead. Scripture reminds us, "Because of the Lord's great love we are not consumed... his mercies never

come to an end; they are new every

morning" (Lamentations 3:22–23). New year, new mercies.

Our hope isn't wishful thinking or resolutions powered by will alone. It's anchored in Jesus Christ—"the same yesterday and today and forever" (Hebrews 13:8). Because He is faithful, we can release the weight of yesterday's regrets, celebrate yesterday's graces, and step into tomorrow with courage. Like Paul, we choose to "forget what lies behind and strain forward to what lies ahead," pressing on to know Christ more deeply (Philippians 3:13–14).

As a church family, let's begin the year with practices that make room for God's renewing work:

- Word: Commit to daily study of scripture.
- Prayer: Start and end each day in conversation with God.
- Worship: Gather weekly; come early, sing loud, stay longer in God's presence.
- Service: Find a way to serve—inside and outside the church—so Christ's love is seen and felt.
- Generosity: Give with open hands, trusting the One who provides.

Luke says that after these things, Jesus appointed seventy disciples (some manuscripts say seventy-two). Their task is to go to the towns and villages they will pass through on the way to Jerusalem. One parallel is that the animals were sent in pairs, and as the ark proved a source of salvation, the teams of disciples brought the message of salvation. The disciples are the lambs, who will enter among wolves, hoping to convert them into lambs. This was a fulfillment of Isaiah's words: "Then wolves and lambs shall feed together" (62:25). What follows is typical of ancient Eastern hospitality.

The Christian practice of hospitality comes from Judaism's tradition of hospitality. God's care for strangers provided the basis for Israel's practice of hospitality—God "loves the sojourner, giving him food and clothing" (Deut. 10:18). Israel was prohibited from afflicting strangers because they had been strangers in Egypt (Exod. 22:21; 23:9). Primitive cultures were suspicious of and distant to strangers since they were unknown and believed to have had dark enchantments. As a result, strangers were often killed or driven away without legal or religious rights. Foreigners later came to be regarded as messengers of the gods, and hospitality was shown only out of fear.

Though Israel left Egypt as strangers, the land they were to inherit was also one in which they would be "strangers and sojourners" with God (Lev. 25:23). Israel received hospitality in Egypt. Still, their sojourn eventually became one of affliction and thus dangerous hospitality—or the lack thereof. God, however, would bring them to a land of relative ease and rest if they would only obey his commandments. By doing this, God gave Israel two contrasting pictures of hospitality—the afflictive treatment from Egypt and the hospitality of love and care from him. God's treatment served as Israel's example of how they should treat strangers and be hospitable since they were once strangers themselves (Exod. 23:9).

The disciples return joyfully, seeing the power in Jesus' name. Then, Jesus says something that appears to be an insult in response to their news. Jesus' reply may have conveyed his lack of surprise at their works, since he had seen Satan cast out of heaven. (cf. Rev. 12:1–6). Their joy should be because their names are written in heaven (v. 20). —Steven

# **Library** E. Bailey Old Brother Hill # 3

Time, as we count it, very often erases all mention of significant individuals whose lives quickly fade away into oblivion as we understand it.

Brother James Riley Hill, who died at the relatively young age of 57 in 1904, is a prime example of how this happens. He and wife and two sons all died between 1904 and 1919 and, at that time, some surviving family member had stones erected to their memory in the Murray City Cemetery.

These matching stones were all cut in the popular obelisk shape of the time. Brother Hill and his wife are memoralized on one stone while sons, Morgan and Charles, each have separate stones matching the style of their parents. All three stones are set in a line of graves.

The sad truth today is that time and weather have essentially eroded the information to the extent that most of it cannot be deciphered today and, unless one knows precisely where to look, these stones are in imminent danger of being lost forever. Perhaps, at some point, we can raise enough \$ to do better.
