In II Samuel 21 David is at war with the Philistines. Just as he had done many years earlier, he fights against a giant. This time, in contrast to his battle with Goliath, he grows faint and it seems that the giant, whose name is Ishbi-Benob, will be victorious. But Abishai comes to his aid, kills Ishbi-Benob, and saves David's life. The next chapter of II Samuel is entirely devoted to David's praise to God for deliverance from his enemies. The entire chapter is worth reading, and you will recognize some verses that we have put to song (vs. 44) but after 50 verses of praising God, David says this in vs. 51, "He is the tower of salvation to His king, and shows mercy to His anointed, to David and his descendants forevermore." This is no doubt a prophecy that foreshadows the coming of Jesus. Jesus is called the Messiah, the anointed, and the Old Testament is full of prophecies concerning what God's plan would eventually bring to fruition. While the reign of David was a time that the Israelites would always remember with fondness, it was full of strife and warfare and trouble. Furthermore, it came to an end, the kingdom would eventually come to ruins, and never regain the glory it enjoyed under David and Solomon. But God, through His wisdom, prepared a King, an Anointed One, a Messiah, and a kingdom that will outlast all others. That King, of course, is Jesus and His kingdom is the Church that He purchased with His blood. You and I will be overcome by our enemies and killed unless we are saved by The King. How great He is! *Seth*

The Great Commission

(Matthew 28:16–20; Mark 16:15–18) Both great commissions emphasize a global endeavor and baptism. Mark 16:9–20 does not appear in the earliest textual manuscripts. Church historian Eusebius is said to have referred to "accurate" manuscripts which lacked the more extended ending. Earlier writers—Clement, Origen, et. al.— did not mention this more extended ending. The first published Greek New Testament (1522) had a more extended ending because of the manuscripts used by Erasmus (translator) contained a more extended ending. Older manuscripts. have since been found and taken into consideration with the more extended ending. However, other writings attest to the longer ending's acceptance and usage (cf. Justin Martyr [AD 160] *First Apology*; Irenaeus [AD 202] *Against Heresies* 3.10.5; et. al.). Some believed (e.g., J. W. McGarvey, Foy E. Wallace, and George DeHoff quoting the latter) that this ending may have been added by another author sometime after Mark wrote the Gospel (compare Gen. 14:14 to Josh. 19:47 and Judg. 18:29). Although, they all believed the passage was authentic and belonged to Mark's Gospel. The scribe who wrote the earliest copy omitting these verses may not have had a complete manuscript from which to copy. Mark 16:8 seems to be worded in an anticipatory manner, and the other Gospels do not end in this abrupt manner. Some have used Mark 16:18–20 to indicate snake handling and drinking poison. No NT evidence exists about such a practice, and no corroborating passages support the act. A man named Justus Barsabbas (cf. Acts 1:23) is recorded to have drunk deadly poison but suffered no harm (Eusebius *Hist. Eccl.* 3.39.9). This narrative does not directly mention Mark 16:18, so this is not an occasion pointing to the fulfillment of the passage.

(Luke 24:44–53) The use of the Old Testament in the New Testament is because of the interpretation Jesus gave to the Old (v. 44). The death, burial, and resurrection were necessary to accomplish the work of God. It wasn't a mistake but a plan. They are to remain in Jerusalem until they literally "put on" (cf. Eph. 6:11) power from on high. Jesus now ascends. When he was born, he brought his divine nature to earth. At his ascension, he brings human nature into the divine kingdom. *—Steven*
