#### **Apostles**

#### The Poor Rich Man

Jesus said to him, "If you want to be perfect, go, sell what you have and give to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven; and come, follow Me." But when the young man heard that saying, he went away sorrowful, for he had great possessions. (Matthew 19:21-22)

This man is often called, "The Rich Young Ruler." Matthew, Mark, and Luke say he was rich. Matthew says he was young (19:22), and Luke 18:18 says he was a ruler. Jesus eventually told this man what to do: Sell all you have and give to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven; and come, follow Me. The call to forsake everything and follow Jesus was a call to put God first in all things. Jesus called the man to full obedience to the first table of the law, which dealt with a man's relation to God. We can make two mistakes regarding the answer Jesus gave this man.

The first mistake is to believe this applies to everyone, when Jesus never made this a general command to all His followers, but especially to this one rich man whose riches were clearly an obstacle to his discipleship. Instead, many rich people can do better by continuing to make money and using those resources for the glory of God and the good of others.

The second mistake is to believe this applies to no one, when there are clearly those today for whom the best thing they could do for themselves spiritually is to radically forsake the materialism that is ruining them. Yet we notice that Jesus simply called this man to be His disciple, in saying, follow Me. He used similar language in calling many of His disciples (Matthew 4:19; 8:22; 9:9; Mark 2:14). Jesus simply called this man to be His follower; but for this man it meant leaving behind the riches he had set his heart upon. Yet, the man went away sorrowful, for he had great possessions. In this, the wealthy questioner failed utterly. Money was his god; he was guilty of idolatry. This is why Jesus, knowing the man's heart, asked him to renounce his possessions.

The rich young ruler had a lot going for him: his youth, his wealth, his influence. Yet he knew these things didn't satisfy. That's why he asked Jesus the question. Sadly, he refused to put Jesus first in all things and went away sorry and empty.

Jesus selected twelve men from his disciples (cf. Luke 10:1–12) who became apostles. Christ made this selection after a night of prayer. The term translated as "Christ's all-night prayer" is used only here in the New Testament, and it denotes "an all-night prayer vigil," which suggests a complete trust in God's selection of the twelve. These disciples would be the standard bearers of the church. An apostle was "sent forth," like an ambassador. Apostles were heads of the church in Christ's absence (1 Cor. 12:28; Eph. 4:11); hence, the early church devoted itself to apostolic teaching (Acts 2:42). The selection of twelve was likely intended to replace the concept of the twelve tribes of Israel, thereby defining Jesus' followers as the reconstituted people of God. The twelve had a special mission and were hand-selected by Christ. However, the twelve were not the only ones called apostles (cf. 1 Cor. 15:5–7). The term seemed to have been sometimes used regarding missionaries as well, when they were sent from congregations (Acts 14:14). However, it cannot be said that these were of the same authority as the twelve.

Whenever Judas was replaced, his replacement was to be one who accompanied them during the time that Jesus was among them from the baptism of John until his ascension (Acts 1:21–22). The only apostle whose office didn't fit the requirements of Judas' replacement was the apostle Paul, but we know that Paul was likely in Jerusalem at the time of Christ's ministry (cf. Acts 22:3; 26:4). We don't know if he encountered Christ or heard him. Paul's apostleship was disputed in the early church, but he contended that he was equal with Peter and the others (Gal. 2:7–9).

Men would later call themselves apostles while claiming many characteristics of Jesus' chosen apostles (2 Cor. 11:5ff; Rev. 2:2), but these were not to be obeyed. Once Jesus made his selection, he and they came down the mountain and stood on a level place. This doesn't indicate that he came down but that he found a level place on the side of the hill from which he could address his disciples. The crowd benefited from his teaching but was directed to follow him as his disciples (Luke 6:20). Jesus then healed many who were ill and those who were possessed. As they touched Jesus, they enjoyed his power. -Steven
