After the Mount of Transfiguration, Jesus and the three come down the mountain to find scribes disputing with the rest of the disciples. The nature of their dispute is not detailed, but it only highlights the tension between Jesus' ministry and the scribes. For example, Jesus learned that a man brought his son to be healed, but the disciples could not heal him. Previously, when Jesus refers to unbelieving generations (Mark 8:12, 38), he's speaking regarding those who deny and oppose him. In this case, that would be directed at the scribes who undoubtedly challenge the validity of his ministry.

The boy's episode resembles epilepsy, which has led many to give a naturalistic explanation of the events. Though Jesus and his disciples held a prescientific worldview, those who read the text this way have an anti-supernatural bias. Nevertheless, Mark's account contains the father's struggle—he had faith but doubted. Of course, the two aren't mutually exclusive. Those who trust Jesus may struggle with doubt during crises, but at least this man knew it and asked for help. Jesus helped, and the disciples asked about their inability to do this wonder. In Matthew's account, a lack of faith explains why they could not heal the son.

Matthew 17:21 and the last bit of Mark 9:29 may be in brackets or include notes. Some Bibles may contain these in various ways. Those with these verses, usually the KJV and NKJV, were translated from a Greek New Testament based on twelfth-century manuscripts. Newer translations rely on an earlier Greek New Testament, so they don't include them and only give a footnote to this effect.

Jesus informs his disciples for the second time about his upcoming death while in Galilee. Keeping this in mind, they are understandably distraught and confused because he adds more detail than the first time he told them. They go to Capernaum, a city within Galilee, and encounter a group of tax collectors. Jewish men paid the temple tax as commanded by the law (Exod. 30:11-16). Sources conflict over whether this was compulsory or whether some were exempt. Jesus' statement about collecting from sons or foreigners may have brought the Fiscus Iudaicus (Jewish Tax) to mind for Matthew's audience—the gospel being written shortly before the fall of Jerusalem. Matthew's audience, presumably, would have been greater after AD 70. This Roman tax replaced the Temple tax after the destruction of Jerusalem. These funds supported the temple of Jupiter Capitolina in Rome. Rather than cause needless offense, Jesus agrees to pay the tax through another miraculous means.

Library "Their Works Do Follow Them"

Revelation 14:13

In the history of the Restoration Movement in far western Kentucky, no names stand out more prominently than those of Reuben & Marshall Starks. Reuben Starks (1789-1861) was a native of Virginia who moved to Christian County, KY and ultimately settled in Marshall County. He is known to have been the father of at least 6 sons and 5 daughters.

One of the sons was William Marshall Starks (1809-1892) who was born in Christian County & died in Calloway County. This father & son team is credited with establishing the Old Liberty Church near present-day Benton. This was the first Restoration congregation in the Purchase to have been fully organized and had its own building. Remnants of Old Liberty later found themselves as part of Union Hill, near Hardin.

The Starks clan was large and wielded enormous influence over the success of the Churches of Christ in both Calloway & Marshall Counties. Their influence can be felt yet today in congregations throughout our area - including Glendale.
