Baptism of the Holy Spirit

Several baptisms are mentioned in the New Testament: John's baptism of repentance, baptism of fire, baptism for the dead (1 Cor. 15:9), baptism into Moses (1 Cor. 10:1-2), baptism of the Holy Spirit, and baptism in making disciples. Since only Jesus performs this, we have to look and see what exactly it is. Yet, in each gospel account, Jesus is portrayed as one who would baptize with the Holy Spirit, thus being the only administrator of such.

Before he ascended into heaven, Jesus reiterated the promise (Acts 1:4-5), and we see it performed on Pentecost (Acts 2:32-33). There were only two examples in Scripture when this was applied: on Pentecost and Cornelius' household (Acts 10:44-48; 11:15-18). This baptism enabled apostles to remember what they'd learned and be taught by God (John 14:26). They were also able to perform wonders and signs to accompany their preaching (Acts 2:43; cf. Heb. 2:3-4). Concerning Cornelius' household, baptism with the Spirit was more to convince the Jews that Gentiles were worthy of salvation, too (Acts 10:44-48; 11:12). Moreover, it was God's way of acknowledging the Gentiles, and the Jews understood that God makes no distinction (Acts 11:8-9).

Considering the numerous baptism we read about in the New Testament, we must establish a timeline because, by AD 64, Paul wrote that there was only one baptism (Eph. 4:4-6). Jesus was crucified and ascended to heaven anywhere between AD 28-33. We like to think that Jesus was born in AD 1, but he was more than likely born between 4-6 BC, given the dating of the death of Herod. Gentiles received the baptism of the Holy Spirit some 8-10 years later, putting us at AD 43 at the latest. This is important because by the time Paul wrote to the Ephesians, he stated that there was one baptism leading us to conclude that Holy Spirit baptism was no longer a factor. Just as John's baptism was for a time and purpose (cf. Acts 19:1-7), so was Holy Spirit baptism. However, the immersion that makes us disciples of Jesus is universal and unending (Acts 2:38-39).

From The Church Files

In the 113 years since this congregation was reorganized in 1909, we have had a total of 27 different pulpit preachers. The shortest tenure was that of Thomas Vernon Pate who served from October 1934 to May of 1935 and the longest was that of John W. Dale who served 39 years.

It should be noted that, during the early decades, the church was often strapped for money and there were time periods when we had no regular resident preacher. Many of the early ones simply lived in Nashville or Henderson, Tennessee and came up on weekends to speak on Sunday.

As we are celebrating Calloway County's bicentennial this year, there will be more articles drawn from this church's rich history and extensive historical records.
