Silence is Not **Always Golden**

The old saying, "Silence is golden" comes from a longer proverb believed to have originated in ancient Egypt. In 1831, it was first printed in English by poet Thomas Carlyle. The truth is that silence is not always golden. During any assembly of our Church, listen and you'll hear gurgling, whining, fussing, crying and an occasional shriek.

Those wonderful sounds are coming from our children. Our congregation is blessed to be filled with children of all ages. Now you might think it strange to be thankful for these constant sounds. but believe me, I've been in churches where there were no children, and the silence was deafening.

God intended for the church to be filled with children, learning about Jesus, learning the Good News. On one occasion Jesus took a little child and set him by Him, and said, "Whoever receives this little child in My name receives Me; and whoever receives Me receives Him who sent Me. For he who is least among you all will be great." (Luke 9:47-48)

May we always celebrate our children, edify and encourage their parents and continue to grow and thrive as God's family.

Everyone and their mother know Matthew 7:1, and they use it—often inappropriately. Yet, there's more to this passage than telling people not to judge. For example, just a few verses later, Jesus warns against false teachers. To dub a person a false teacher, you have to be willing to judge what they teach and how they live (Matt. 7:15-20). Notice what follows: how we judge is how we will be judged (7:2). This critical person sees only the fault in others but none in themselves (7:3–5). We're to judge righteously (John 7:24). Unrighteous judgment is according to appearance. Righteous judgment, however, is with grace, mercy, and God's will as the standard. There's always a disconnect between what we see and reality. Sometimes the two are the same, but sometimes they're not. When we look for the worst, that's what we'll find every time.

In matters of righteousness, we're to judge our brethren and not outsiders (1 Cor. 5:12). Judgment here isn't a condemnation but discernment. When a Christian doesn't bear fruits of the spirit but works of the flesh, unrepentantly, we're to address the issue. When you read the thought uninterrupted, it flows into the next chapter of 1 Corinthians, which denounced lawsuits among brethren. This matter is one of discipline (cf. Deut. 17:6-7; Matt. 18:15-20).

The good thing is that God is our judge. I'm content to let him have that job, and he hasn't relegated it to me or anyone else. As humans, we can sometimes have biases in our evaluations of things. I think what Jesus was getting at was how the religious leaders of his day lived in the lane of judgment. These were scholars who knew the law and oral tradition of the rabbis. It's like showing an accomplished artist your stick-figure drawing. It's unimpressive to someone so gifted. Because they meditated on the law and oral traditions constantly, it might have been hard to not find fault.

We Christians can become just like those scholars. However, think about Jesus. The people whom the religious leaders likely judged were those who felt comfortable approaching Jesus. They wouldn't have dared approached those leaders. The leaders wanted to be right. Jesus wanted to be effective while maintaining what was right and having compassion on all.

Library *E. Bai* What is Contemporary?

Everyone has a personal definition as to what is "contemporary" and what is "traditional" when it comes to worship styles. This issue has gone so far as to divide churches and some larger ones have dealt with it by simply having two worship periods – one contemporary and one traditional. Others have tried to do what they call "blended" worship which works well in some settings and fails miserably in other congregations.

The flashpoint usually comes down to what style of songs are we going to sing. To me, "contemporary" hymns can be anything written in the last 50 years because it usually takes that long for a "new" song to work its way into the mainstream worship of a church.

One of the first such "new" songs that comes to mind is Karen Lafferty's "Seek Ye First", written in 1972 and now pretty well recognized in churches everywhere. Another example is John Peterson's "Heaven Came Down" written in 1961 and also now universally sung in churches.
